### **Las Vegas High School GEAR UP Abstract**

Las Vegas High School serves approximately 3,300 students: 51% male, 49 % female.

The diverse population includes 13% African American, 11% Asian/Pacific Islander, 48% Hispanic, 1% Native American, and 27% Caucasian. Additionally, 11% of the population is identified as LEP, 9% IEP, and 34% as Free or Reduced Lunch program.

Las Vegas High School Ninth Grade Academy addresses the special needs of students transitioning to high school. AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) strategies and practices are incorporated into all ninth grade classrooms. The schedule provides remediation within the school day and provides flexible scheduling to allow students to receive additional support before and after school hours. Academic support systems address the school improvement goal of increasing the matriculation rates of ninth grade students and increasing reading and math achievement.

Las Vegas High School will support the specific GEAR UP goals as follows: student achievement through remediation built into the school day with extra courses before and after school to provide both support and enrichment; college access through additional support for the College Career Center to ensure students are beginning their college portfolios, speakers from colleges, career strands, and college tours; parent involvement through on campus parent night/weekend activities and *ParentLink*.
