The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding revisions to regulation language that pertain to **NAC 388** of the Nevada Administrative Code.

The need and purpose of the proposed amendments to NAC 388.300 is due to changes on December 31, 2008 to the federal regulations associated with Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) were revised to provide provisions for the revocation of parental consent for special education services. The NAC is currently out of alignment with the federal regulations at 34 CFR Part 300. This change will bring the state regulation into alignment with the federal regulations.

These proposed regulatory changes were reviewed and approved by the Special Education District Administrators (SEDA) on December 10, 2009 and the Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) on January 12, 2010, with both groups recommending approval by the State Board of Education

There is no economic effect on the Department of Education or on the schools and school districts.

There is no cost to the Department of Education to adopt these regulations. There is no duplication or overlap of state or local governmental agencies. The proposed regulations do not establish a new fee nor increase an existing fee of the regulating agency.
