English Mastery Council (EMC) Annual Status Report

February 2, 2017 to February 2, 2018

Background

During the 2013 legislative session, the Nevada State Legislature enacted Senate Bill 504 (SB 504) to address the linguistic and academic needs of English Learners in Nevada's public schools. As part of SB 504, as enacted, Nevada created the English Mastery Council (EMC) [NRS 388.409] which was directed to provide recommendations to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, the State Board of Education (SBE), Commission on Professional Standards (COPS), Board of Regents, and school districts [NRS 388.411].

The Council was also directed to provide an annual report to the Governor, State Board, and the Director of the Legislative Committee on Education (LCE) concerning the status of the Council in carrying out its duties and a description of the recommendations made by the Council to the entities identified in paragraph one [NRS 388.413]. This report satisfies those requirements.

Organization of the EMC/Membership

As outlined in NRS 388.409, the EMC is made up of sixteen members from differing backgrounds and responsibilities. Individuals are nominated by statutorily defined representative organizations and are appointed by the Governor, the Chancellor of the Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE), or the Superintendent of Public Instruction. Each appointed member serves a 2-year term and may be appointed for additional terms.

Duties of the English Mastery Council

The primary responsibility of the EMC is to provide recommendations that will help ensure that English Learners in Nevada's public schools (Pre-Kindergarten through grade 12) have access to quality education programs. NRS 388.405 states, "It is the intent of the Legislature that children who are limited English proficient be provided with services and instruction which is designed to address the academic needs of such children so that those children attain proficiency in the English language and improve their overall academic and linguistic achievement and proficiency."
