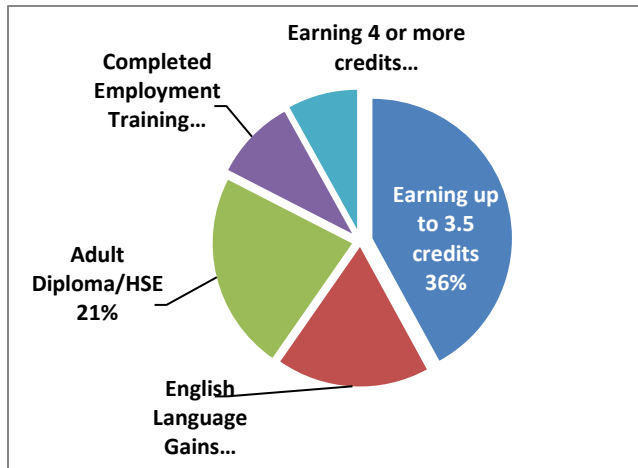

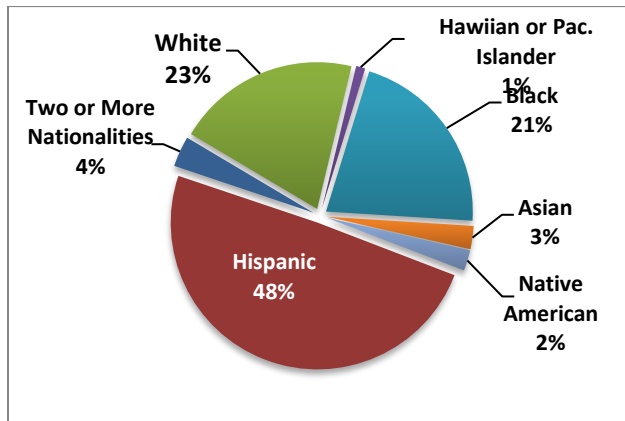

FY20 Adult Learner Outcomes



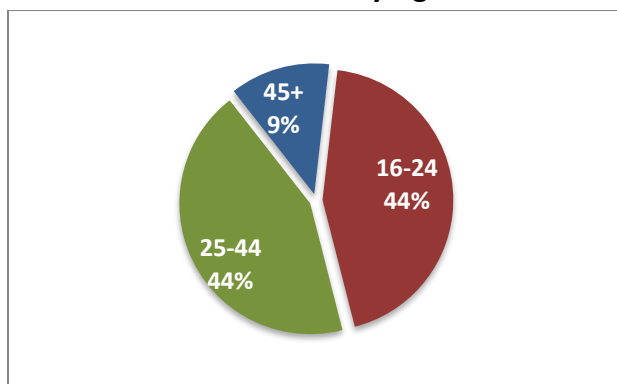

Adult High Schools provide opportunities for Nevada adults to:

Return to school and earn their High School Equivalency Certificate or Adult High School Diploma

- ❖ Get a job
- ❖ Keep their job
- ❖ Get off welfare
- ❖ Transfer to college or other career and technical training programs
- ❖ Learn English language skills, understand US culture, and participate in society
- ❖ Help their children with homework and be successful in school

Adult High Schools Provide Diplomas and Certificates

- ❖ 3,074 adult high school diplomas and HSE were awarded in 2018-2019
- ❖ 761 students completed employability training
- ❖ 15,190 students made gains toward their educational goals

Enrollment in AHSD Programs Decline

In FY20, the AHSD program served 14,048 students. This is a decrease of 1,148 students compared to the students served in FY19. This decrease can be attributed to the state-wide shutdown caused by COVID-19.
