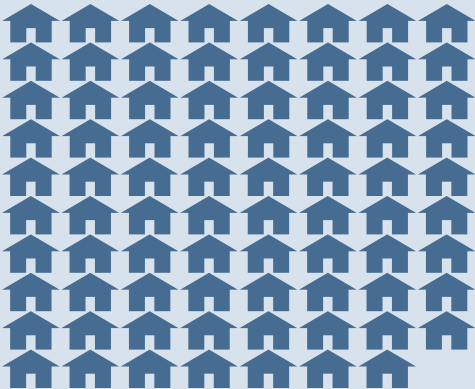

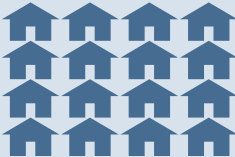

2018 Operator Context

- This year we are not putting forward a “transformation” option. No organization will assume the operations of and existing school.
- Both approved operators are “neighborhood options” and will open in areas of high need.

School Performance Context

Of the 79 schools that are eligible for the Nevada ASD this year:

- 47 have been identified as a Rising Star School for at least two of the last three years
- 25 have been eligible for the Nevada ASD for at least two of the last three years

Recommendation Process

- Review current and historical data (Star Rating, Proficiency, Growth, ACT Score, Equity, Graduation Rate, Credit Attainment, Attendance and School Environment) to prioritize schools

- Identified 53 of 79 schools as Tier 1 or High Priority

- Recommend 16 of the High Priority schools taking into consideration *2018 Operator Context* and *2018 School Performance Context*

- Encourage the 37 remaining High Priority schools to consider signing an agreement with the Nevada Department of Education to establish targets to reach 3-Stars in 3 years

State Board of Education's Role

- **NRS 388B.200(2)** Within 30 days after the list is submitted, the State Board shall approve at least 50 percent of the schools on the list.
- **Regulation R108-15, Section 15(2)** “...the State Board shall consider any relevant information, including, without limitation, *historical data* concerning the public school that is maintained pursuant to the statewide system of accountability for public schools and any *efforts by the board of trustees* of the school district in which the public school is located to improve pupil achievement and school performance at the public school.”

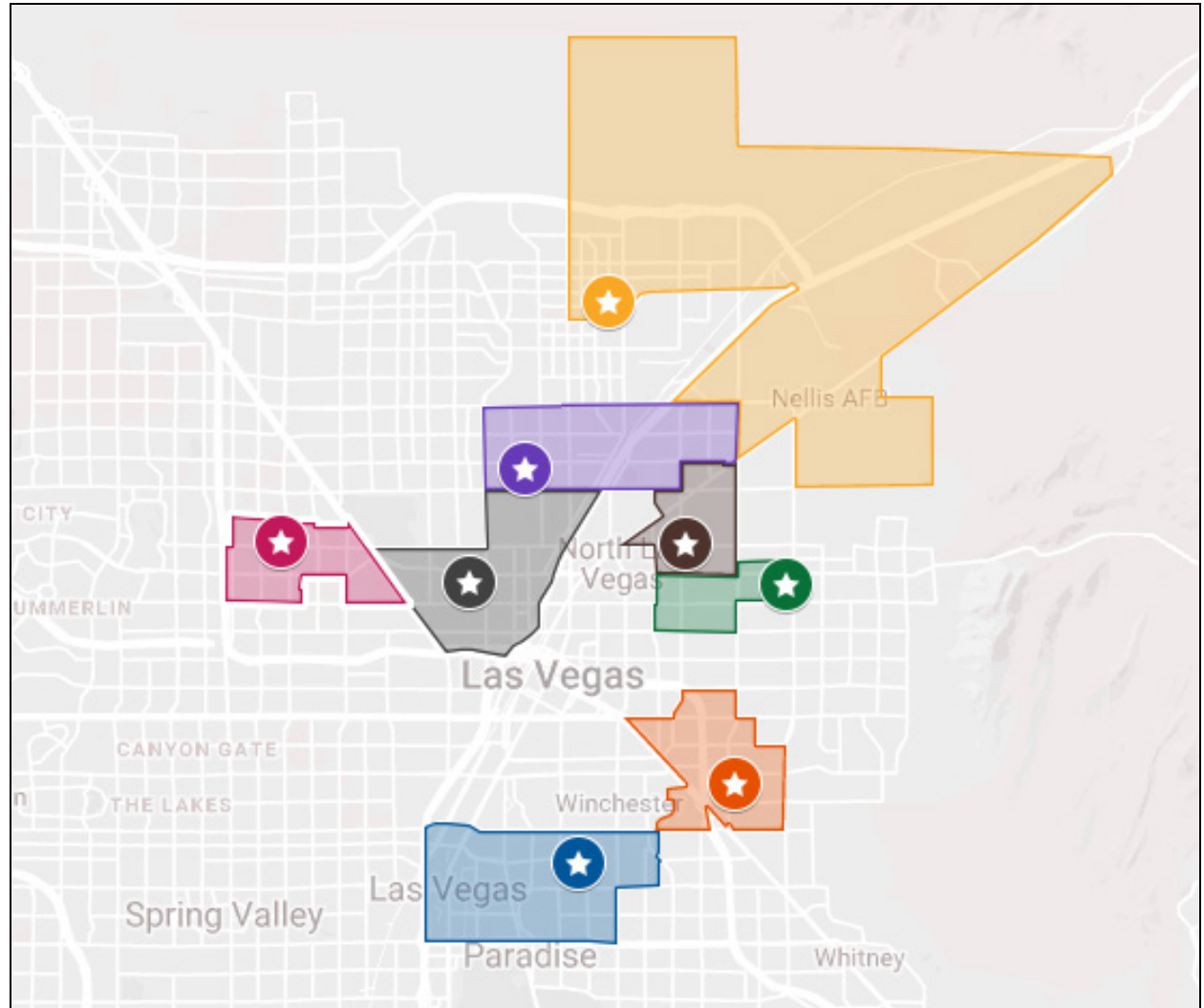
District Efforts
