CREDIT TOWARD GRADUATION FROM HIGH SCHOOL  
FOR COURSES TAKEN THROUGH THE NEVADA SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 389.160 requires approval of courses for which high school credit is granted from both the Board of School Trustees of each county school district and the State Board of Education. Courses to be considered for dual credit are listed below. The dual credit courses listed below are in addition to courses previously approved by the Board of School Trustees.

If approved, students will receive credit towards high school graduation from the Clark County School District and simultaneously receive college credit. The aforementioned courses will be designated as dual credit in school course catalogs.

Should the Board of School Trustees not approve these courses for dual credit, students concurrently enrolled in these classes will not earn high school credit.

Discussion and possible action to approve high school dual credit coursework, aligned to the Nevada System of Higher Education, for the purpose of articulation, with no impact to the general budget, is recommended.
