

COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS (CCR) ASSESSMENT

STAKEHOLDER SURVEY

DEMOGRAPHIC ANALYSIS

Language & Race/Ethnicity

The survey was offered in three languages. 1697 responses were submitted to the English language survey, 8 to Spanish, and 0 to Tagalog.

In identifying race/ethnicity, 317 respondents, about 19%, chose not to provide an answer. Of the 1388 provided responses, the vast majority of respondents identified themselves as white, with Hispanic respondents making the second-largest group.

Local Education Agency

Respondents were given the opportunity to identify their local education agency. Forty-seven (47) respondents left this survey item blank. Of the remaining 1658 responses, Clark County represented a majority segment relatively consistent with state student population distributions.

Stakeholder Role
