# Overview of Federal Perkins CTE Grants Opportunities

The purpose of Perkins' career and technical education (CTE) grant funding is to:

- 1) provide career exploration and career development activities through an organized, systematic framework designed to aid students, including in the middle grades, before enrolling and while participating in career and technical education programs, in making informed plans and decisions about future education and career opportunities and programs of study;
- 2) provide professional development for teachers, faculty, school leaders, administrators, specialized instructional support personnel, career guidance, and academic counselors, or paraprofessionals;
- 3) provide within career and technical education the skills necessary to pursue high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand industry sectors or occupations;
- 4) support integration of academic skills into career and technical education programs and programs of study to support;
- 5) plan and carry out elements that support the implementation of career and technical education programs and programs of study and that result in increasing student achievement of the local levels of performance; and,
- 6) develop and implement evaluations of the activities carried out with Perkins V local funds, including evaluations necessary to complete the comprehensive needs assessment required under section 134(c) and the local report required under section 113(b)(4)(B) of Perkins V.

## **Perkins Local Formula**

### **Eligible Recipients**

- Public secondary and postsecondary local education agencies (LEAs) offering recognized Nevada CTE programs of study;
- Public charter schools that offered and had enrollment in a recognized Nevada CTE program of study in FY22; and
- These recognized agencies that submit an FY23 Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment Guide (CLNA) are eligible to apply for this grant funding in FY23.

### **Funding**

Allocated funding is based on a formula. See the Carl D. Perkins Allocation Chart for Use with FY23 application development for beginning funding amounts.

#### ***Secondary Education Formula***

Local Formula grant amounts for secondary education agencies are based on the estimated allocation for Nevada as determined by the USDOE. The amounts are based on ages 5-17 populations and poverty rates and are subject to the receipt of funding from the Federal appropriations made for this Act. Secondary agencies receive 63% of the local funds, less the amount set aside for the reserve fund allocation. Local formula fund amounts for secondary education agencies are based on the estimated allocation for Nevada as determined by the USDOE.

#### ***Postsecondary Education Formula***

The amounts are based on the Pell Grant counts as reported by the Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE). The amount allocated is 37% of the total local funds, less the amount set aside for the reserve fund allocation. Local formula fund amounts for postsecondary education agencies are based on the estimated allocation for Nevada as determined by the USDOE.

## **Perkins Rural Reserve**

### **Eligible Recipients**

- Public secondary LEAs offering *recognized* Nevada CTE programs of study;
- Public charter schools that offered a recognized Nevada CTE program of study in FY 2022;
- These recognized agencies that submit an FY23 Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment Guide (CLNA) ; and
- Perkins Local Formula funds available are approximately or less than \$15,000.00 are eligible to apply for this grant funding in FY23

## **Funding**

Perkins Local Formula funding is allocated based on the secondary funding formula described above. Rural Reserve funding is available for each LEA/eligible agency, (that receives approximately or less than \$15,000.00 of Local Formula funds) to obtain additional funding.

## **Perkins Reserve Competitive**

### **Eligible Recipients**

- Public postsecondary LEAs offering *recognized* CTE programs.
- These recognized agencies that submit an FY23 Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment Guide (CLNA) are eligible to apply for this grant funding in FY23

### **Funding**

Purpose of Perkins Reserve Competitive funding is to foster innovation through the identification and promotion of promising and proven career and technical education programs, practices, and strategies, which may include programs, practices, and strategies that prepare individuals for nontraditional fields; or, promote the development, implementation, and adoption of programs of study or career pathways aligned with State-identified high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand occupations or industries. Said funding will support career and technical education activities in:

- rural areas;
- areas with high percentages of CTE concentrators or CTE participants;
- areas with high numbers of CTE concentrators or CTE participants; and,
- areas with disparities or gaps in performance.

## **Perkins Corrections**

### **Eligible Recipients:**

- Public secondary LEAs offering *recognized* Nevada CTE programs of study in youth corrections programs, including, but not limited to: Clark, Douglas, and Lincoln County school districts; and the Nevada Youth Training Center.
- These recognized agencies that submit an FY23 Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment Guide (CLNA) are eligible to apply for this grant funding in FY23.

### **Funding:**

Allocated funding for the purpose of providing CTE program opportunities for students in youth correctional programs.

## **Perkins Non-traditional Competitive**

### **Eligible Recipients:**

- Public secondary and postsecondary local education agencies (LEAs) offering recognized Nevada CTE programs of study;
- Public charter schools that offered and had enrollment in a recognized Nevada CTE program of study in FY22; and
- These recognized agencies that submit an FY23 Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment Guide (CLNA) are eligible to apply for this grant funding in FY23.

### **Funding:**

Purpose of Perkins Nontraditional Training and Employment funding is to prepare individuals for non-traditional fields. Nontraditional employment is defined as occupations or fields of work for which individuals from one gender comprise less than 25 percent of the individuals employed in each such occupations or fields of work.

Available funding: \$60,000.00

**RFA Release:** February 14, 2022

**Submission Deadline:** March 29, 2022

**NOTE:** LEAs/eligible agencies receiving Perkins grant funding conducted a **Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment (CLNA)** related to CTE and included a summary of the results of the needs assessment in the FY21 local application; said CLNA shall be updated not less than once every two (2) years. (Perkins V., sec. 134). To be eligible to receive Perkins grant funding in FY23, a new CLNA is required with the FY23 application.
