



Nevada Commission on Mentoring Grant Application for FY2022-23 Spring and Summer Micro-Grants

Overview

The Nevada Commission on Mentoring (NCOM) is offering micro-grants to mentoring non-profit organizations/programs in the state of Nevada. The Commission on Mentoring was established to support and facilitate mentorship programs in the state of Nevada and work in consultation with the Nevada Department of Education to provide direction and guidance to the State Coordinator for mentorship programs. NCOM is required by state statute to **develop a grants program** and **award money to organizations**. The state statute is as follows:

AB 235 Section 3: (f) Within the limits of legislative appropriations, develop a competitive grants program to award grants of money to mentorship programs in this State. In coordination with the Office of Grant Procurement, Coordination and Management of the Department of Administration, the Commission shall:

- (1) Administer the grants program;
- (2) Establish guidelines for the submission and review of applications to receive grants from the program; and
- (3) Consider and approve or disapprove applications for grants from the program.

February 6, 2023	NCOM Grant application will be available
February 6-March 31, 2023	Two-month period to complete grant application
March 31, 2023	Grant application due by 6:00 PM
May 5, 2023	Selected organizations will be notified
May 5-June 16, 2023	Award money will be used in this period
June 30, 2023	Organizations must report expenditures to the Nevada Commission on Mentoring
